The Lesser Tetractys The Tetrad and Decad

Editor's Note: Final part of a four part series on the tetractys or tetrad, a triangular figure consisting of ten points arranged in four rows: one, two, three, and four points in each row, which is the geometrical representation of the fourth triangular number.

The World of Action and the Number Four

The last and bottom row of the Lesser Tetractys consists of four points, and is referred to as the tetrad, meaning a group of four. It is the lowest level of the Tetractys and represents the third dimension. The fourth point added to the previous three brings balance into perpetual action through harmony¹. Harmony can be seen as actions or vibrations working in unity with each other. This equilibrium produces permanence creating the existence of the physical realm through the world of Action². In the western world the Pythagoreans specialized in the study of numerology, and for them the number four was revered as "the greatest miracle" and the "fountain of nature"³.

Numerology and the Tarot

Numerology is a mystical art that utilizes numbers as symbols to represent philosophical and spiritual teachings. It is used in mystical systems such as Tarot which also incorporates both images and numerology as symbols in order to better understand the nature of this world – the world of Action.

Tarot has often been frowned upon by many religious and non-religious conservatives who are not completely familiar with the benefits around some of its applications. Like many other forms of discipline, including religion, Tarot can be used in a personal and practical way for reflection and meditation which requires study and devotion, or it can be used for social entertainment; both uses can have either good or evil intentions and results. Some may discover that the symbolism of the Tarot card system can be moderately applied to almost any form of faith or discipline without contradiction. Like many mystical arts, it can be used as a tool to better understand the cycles and personalities of human nature and this lower world of polarities expressed through action.

The Spirit (Infinite) "3" and Physical (Finite) "4"

This three dimensional world of Action is where man begins to experience the conflict and union of polarities, rhythms and vibrations. It contains the will of the Deity (monad), the understanding of polarity (dyad), the balance found in their union (triad), and the harmonious actions expressed through the laws by which they are governed (tetrad).

The Fourth Key of the Major Arcana⁴ shows the Emperor sitting on a cube. The Emperor is said to symbolize the "first and heavenly Adam," as well as symbolizing reason; the cube symbolizes the Emperor's throne or the "field of material phenomena"⁵. The fourth card reveals a combination of the spiritual element with the physical element; both are designed to work in harmony in the world of Action. The balance and harmony between the two can be associated with the tetrahedron, a three dimensional four sided triangle – hence the numbers four and three operating together forming the seven.

The Portions of Man's Soul/Light in Action

The spiritual essence of man is a complex subject that requires much reflection and study. There are many different views around this subject that should be respected, valued and considered; this is only one of many speculations.

Prior to the fall, Man had five portions of the complete soul contained within three levels by which he was clothed in light. With these three levels, Adam incorporated all four worlds of Emanation, Creation, Formation, and Action. After the fall, level one of Adam's souls – the portions pertaining to the higher aspects of the worlds of Emanation and Creation – returned to its holy place. The two lower levels of soul remained in Adam and descended with him after the fall⁶.

The 5 portions of man's soul are contained in three levels and are associated by a connection to the Divine Name (YHVH). The "Yod" being the first and highest level, contains the union of the two highest portions of the original soul of man. We are forbidden to inquire of "Yod" because it is ineffable and most Holy in the world of Action. Adam and Eve's higher portions of their souls were removed from them at the time of their sin. This would be the death associated with the promise of "you shall surely die" (*Genesis 2:17*). This loss of the higher portions of soul clothing them would also be associated with leaving them "naked" (*Genesis 3:7*) with only the two levels of soul along with the three lower portions contained within them.

Master Craftsman Program

Jurisdiction Supreme Council

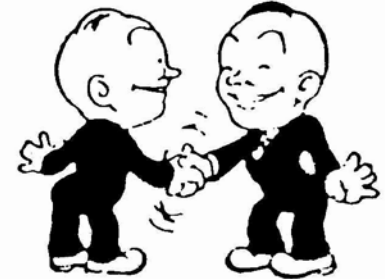
The jurisdiction of this Supreme Council includes all the territory over which the United States of America exercises domain of powers of government, except the states of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, and Wisconsin, which were apportioned by this Supreme Council to the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction of the United States. The jurisdiction of this Supreme Council also includes those countries where it has established, or may hereafter establish, Bodies of the Rite, and over which countries no regular Supreme Council has acquired jurisdiction.

Rite Care Eligibility

As a rule, the five Scottish Rite Childhood Learning Clinics accept preschool children who have difficulty speaking or understanding the spoken word or school-age children who have difficulty learning to read.

Inquiries on age groups and program offerings in specific areas should be addressed to the director of the local Scottish Rite facility. Equally important, all services are available regardless of race, creed, or the family's inability to pay.

The Lesser Tetractys - The Tetrad and Decad:

The portions of man's soul that descended are known as the Nefesh, found in the blood and associated with the final Hebrew letter "Heh" of YHVH; the Ruach, found in the spirit or wind and is associated with the Hebrew letter "Vav" of YHVH; and Neshema, from the Divine Breath connected to the intellect and is associated with the first Hebrew letter "Heh" of YHVH⁷. The Hebrew letter "Yod"⁸ of YHVH is associated with the two higher portions of soul known as Chayah from the Living Essence and Yachidah from the Unique Essence – which both contain a mystery that is beyond our comprehension in the world of Action alone⁹.

The Nefesh, Ruach and Neshemah make up the spiritual element of man in this dimension, and can be symbolized by an equilateral triangle which is a reflection of the Supernal Triangle. In Freemasonry we can associate the number three with Faith, Hope and Charity, as these are spiritual motivations designed to employ our actions.

The physical element of man consists of the four Supernal Elements of fire, wind, water, and dust. They are associated with the four directions of north (fire), east (wind), south (water), and west (dust). These four Supernal Elements are also associated with the Divine Name YHVH in the form of the Holy Merkavah (Holy Chariot)¹⁰. This physical element of man can be symbolized by the square. In Freemasonry we can associate the number four with the four cardinal virtues, as these make up the foundation of the Temple and are designed to govern our actions. The number 4 is also associated with justice, which is the fourth virtue.

The three added to the four gives us the number 7; the number 7 is symbolic of force and victory. Key 7 is the Chariot and represents the entirety of creation in motion¹¹.

The Significance of the Lower Four

There are four characteristics of our third dimension that have a direct impact on man and are accepted as natural in this world of Action; they are: good, evil, sustenance, and law. These four aspects actively govern and sustain all our actions. Every individual has their own interpretation around how these characteristics are defined, applied and measured.

One may gain a better understanding by relating "good" to life

and growth, "evil" to death and separation, "sustenance" to stability and nourishment, and "law" to restriction and governance. These four characteristics are designed to provide perpetual energy in the world of Action. By these four our actions reveal our character.

The bottom row of the Lesser Tetractys can be related to the lower four Sephirot on the Tree of Life symbol. These four are Netzach (Dominance/Victory/Eternity/7th Sephirah), Hod Splendor/Empathy/8th Sephirah), Yesod (Foundation/9th Sephirah), and Malchut (kingdom/10th Sephirah).

Netzach, Hod and Yesod become the lower triad. As previously mentioned, the upper triad consists of the Sephirot of Chesed (4th Sephirah), Gevurah (5th Sephirah), and Tiferet (6th Sephirah). The upper and lower triads, which are found in the "Vav" of YHVH, make up the world of Formation that is sustained by the world of Creation through their connection to Binah (understanding) – the first "Heh" of YHVH.

Malchut (10th Sephirah) is related to the fourth and last point on the bottom row of the Tetractys. It is the world of Action found in the final "Heh" of YHVH, and is connected to the upper and lower triads by Yesod. Malchut contains the whole of creation with its highest element (the Word derived from Keter and Chochmah¹²) buried and hidden deep within.

The upper and lower triads represent the Deity's 6 days of "active" creation, while Malchut (the world of Action) represents the Deity's "resting" from creation known as the Sabbath. The Sabbath was created for man¹³ to allow creation to be in existence "acting" in formation under the laws of nature set to govern it by the Deity. Although the Deity rests from creating on the seventh day, the Deity continuously sustains life and intervenes to correct the imbalances caused by sin associated with the free will of man.

The fourth commandment tells us to remember the Sabbath and keep it Holy; we are told to set the seventh day aside as reverence to that command¹⁴. In doing so, we are able to reflect on our work in comparison to the work of the Deity. This ensures that we are able to readjust our intentions and actions, and continue striving to utilize the laws that were set to govern good and evil in a way that stimulates life. We are not called to create or to destroy good or evil – this brings chaos; the Deity has created both for reasons beyond our comprehension. We are dying, but we are called to action so that we may live. Good and evil as we know it are given their dominion in this lower world, and are both constantly in "action".

The Lesser Tetractys & the 14° Ring of the Lodge of Perfection

The number four is "the greatest miracle" in that when calculating through its entirety the number ten is concluded (1+2+3+4=10). The number ten "contains the entire enigma of life"¹⁵ and signifies "the perfection of divine order" and completeness¹⁶. The number four is a "fountain of nature" in that it employs the enduring cycles

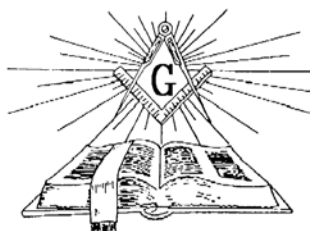

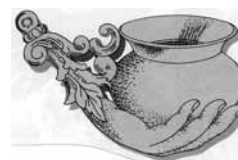

He is proving to be a machinist and part artist as well, along with his DeMolay work and of course he is Master R. F. McGuire 209. It is good to be young and full of P&V (they tell me). The Lesser Tetractys - The Tetrad and Decad:

of life and death within the confines of time and space.

When contemplating the significance of the Lesser Tetractys, one may reflect upon the whole of creation through the symbolism offered to us in numerology. The numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4 represent the work of the Deity contained in the first "Heh" of YHVH without the interruptions of man's free will. The number 10 represents the redemptive and complete work of the Deity found in the "Yod" of YHVH¹⁷. The numbers 6, 7, 8 and 9 are the formative numbers found in the "Vav" of YHVH provided to man and expressed in his free will through the final "Heh" of YHVH. The number 5 represents the creation of animal life¹⁸ as well as the provision of healing, redemption and reconciliation found in the final "Heh" of YHVH and begins the "Great Work"¹⁹.

This "Great Work" is executed with the resources of knowledge found in the "Vav" which are designed to lead man toward correction so that he may discover the perfection and completeness found in the "Yod" of YHVH. This perfection can only be discovered by connecting the lower "Heh" to the upper "Heh" by way of the "Vav"; the work is found in the "Vav" (6 days of creation) and set into motion through the final "Heh" (the Sabbath) of YHVH.

The Lesser Tetractys can also be reflected in the 14° ring of the Lodge of Perfection. The 14° ring recalls the Holy treasure discovered in the 13° that contained the ineffable name of Deity²⁰ by which all creation came into being. The ring's inscription and symbol together "symbolizes the immutable and eternal nature of Masonic virtues and the brotherhood they inspire"²¹. It consists of an equilateral triangle with the Hebrew letter "Yod" set in its center. With this consideration, the equilateral triangle may represent, without contradiction, the Triune work of the Deity that contains "the perfection of divine order" symbolized by the Hebrew letter "Yod".

In Conclusion

The world of Action is referred to as "kingdom" because it is bound and restricted by the laws that govern it – it is a place of ruler-ship. On the fourth day the Creator established laws that govern time and space, and gave proper dominion to the heavenly bodies²².

The laws governing this lower World were written and enforced with the consideration and dominion from all four worlds previously discussed. Since we have lost the higher portions of our dominion through the fall, we have limited access to the essence, understanding and wisdom contained within the laws of the highest worlds we were created to employ.

This loss complicates our journey, and we often find ourselves acting contrary to the laws that were designed to bring us unity and harmony. As a result we see our world through murky waters, but are still bound by cause and effect. When the laws are broken a correction must be made and paid for by somebody; natural law provides no mercy.

In this world of Action one should always strive to consider the effects that may result from one's actions, and come to understand that everything comes as either a gift to be received or a price to be paid. We are all continually bound in darkness and in search of more light; none of us see clearly. When faced with opposition, one should remember to keep the Sabbath (our actions) Holy, and learn to reflect the Light from the Word rather than the laws that condemn and bind. Receive from the Deity rather than take from man, and don't begrudge a Brother's blessing.

Prayer is a Holy form of action designed to align our intentions with the perfect Will of the Deity. Everyone can do it! It requires no formal education or degree to be great at it, only dedication and a passion for Truth. This draws the Bride from the Kingdom in preparation for the Wedding. Darkness is continually around us, which is why we need a "lamp for our feet and a light for our path"²³; so we must actively pray for one another according to the Word.

Leave Your High School Outside

Many years ago, almost sixty now, as a young DeMolay, I eagerly attended my Chapter's semi-monthly meeting in coat and tie, the way we all dressed – in our Sunday's best. I was a freshman at Baton Rouge High, my Dad's alma mater, and about half of the DeMolay Chapter attended that incredible school. The other half attended Istrouma High, the ultimate rival – the Baton Rouge High Bulldogs against the Istrouma High Indians. During football season, the lines in the City of Baton Rouge were drawn – South, Baton Rouge High; North, Istrouma High. After "the Season", normalcy returned pretty much. In the DeMolay Chapter however, the terms were six months long and the incoming Master Councilor almost always alternated schools – and with him came "his" set of appointed Officers. The new Master Councilor who attended Istrouma High cleaned house and appointed Istrouma High members – back and forth. My first appointment was 2nd Preceptor, next Term nothing, then Orator, next Term nothing. So it went. Life lessons learned about winning and not winning. Back then it was character building and not everyone got an award.

We had an old Advisor, Capt. Henri Herff, who had served in World War I, helped run the Panama Canal, moved to Baton Rouge in the mid-1930's after retirement and became very involved in all branches of Masonry. He had helped start DeMolay in the Panama Canal Zone, was a personal friend of DeMolay's Founder, Dad Frank S. Land, and in 1941 re-started DeMolay in Baton Rouge. The big social event of the Baton Rouge DeMolay Year, the Valentine's Sweetheart Banquet, was being planned and the venue was being debated. The meeting to vote and decide had members attend who were not "regulars" but were stakeholders. It looked bleak for the Baton Rouge High side as we gathered downstairs before the meeting. At the appointed time, we all filed upstairs and standing in the doorway, I later learned called the Outer Door, was Dad Herff. He pointed his old grizzled finger at each DeMolay as we entered the Chapter Room and with deliberate voice said, "Leave Your High School Outside!" We voted and came together as a Chapter, had a healthy debate, but settled on the best restaurant with the best

banquet room and a reasonable price for a banquet meal – it was a great event.

I have remembered that night over and over, and that old Advisor pointing his finger and telling us to remember what we belonged to first and foremost – a Brotherhood, second, the best for the majority, and then, leave personal piques and quarrels outside – and practicing that Brotherhood, forgive.

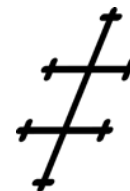
Years later, I attended a Lodge regularly where the Worshipful Master always began every meeting, before bringing the gavel down, by saying, "Brethren, you have entered a sacred place and you need to leave the world outside!"

Brethren, Scottish Rite's beautiful and meaningful Degrees teaches us just what Dad Herff and that Worshipful Master intoned – If we can live the lessons inside that sacred space, beginning with the gathering in the Lodge of Perfection, we can truly become Masters of the Royal Secret: balance, equilibrium, inner peace, love for our fellow man, and practicing the Civility that Masonry offers to all of its votaries. We are gentlemen and we are Brothers.

Unfortunately, such has not been the case recently in our Grand Jurisdiction. Law Suits filed, heated arguments, non-unity Unity gatherings, name-calling, groups of long-standing friends divided, Brother against Brother. Sides taken and lines drawn. Try as hard as possible to stay neutral, Scottish Rite has truly had no part in any of this, yet some try to pull our beloved Rite into the middle. If only old Dad Herff were still around pointing that finger reminding every Brother who entered the sacred space to leave his rivalry, his "side", his hurt feelings outside, what a Grand Jurisdiction overflowing with Peace & Harmony we would enjoy. Our 18th Degree teaches – Love one another, be better than yourself, and remember the more that you have, the more you owe to those less fortunate – lessons of The Master. Can we truly be Knights of the Rosy Cross? We promised. Dad Herff still stands at that Outer Door, YOU guard the Inner Door. Guard well and remember the lessons taught in our beautiful Rite; as you enter each time that sacred space, be it Lodge, Grand Lodge and our Lodge of Perfection, can you "leave your high school outside"? The future of our Fraternity and of our Rite depends on it.

Because of the issues mentioned, Scottish Rite, as a side issue of the disputes has lost some truly outstanding Brothers to Demit. Seek these good Brothers, young and old, and ask them to return with you and help heal our Masonry. Have you attended your Valley's monthly meeting recently? I ask you again to check on a Brother who is missing from your last meeting – a quick phone call, an email, a card, a visit by his house – reach out – be a Brother!

Did You Know?

In the early 1950s the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States initiated a program to help children with speech and language disorders. The results obtained from this program led to the establishment of RiteCare Scottish Rite Childhood Language Program clinics to provide diagnostic evaluation and treatment of speech and language disorders, as well as learning disabilities.

Today, there are SRCLP clinics, centers, and special programs operating or planned for children and therapists located throughout the United States. Each facility is staffed by speech-language pathologists or other trained personnel. Through the support of Scottish Rite members, these clinics, centers, and programs continue to increase. The value of this philanthropy has long been apparent. Tens of thousands of youngsters across the United States have been helped significantly. With the good work of dedicated clinicians and parents, the Scottish Rite has achieved successes that could only be imagined a few years back. Children who might have remained educationally behind for a lifetime can now talk, read, and lead productive lives.
